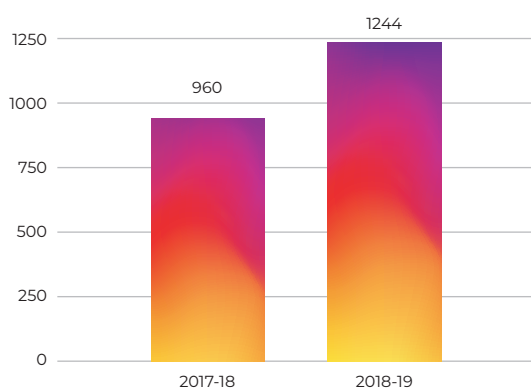

LBCC increased the number of Associate Degrees for Transfer by **29%**. Students who are awarded these degrees and meet the CSU's minimum eligibility requirements are guaranteed priority admission to a CSU campus.

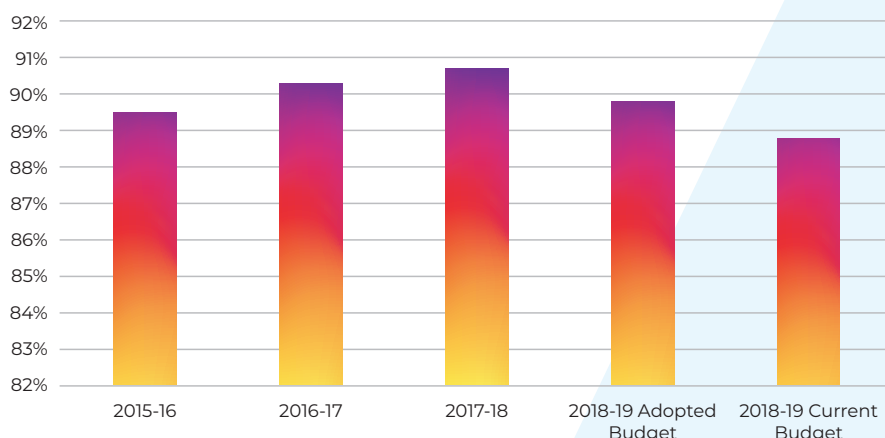

Facing an upward trend in employee salaries and benefits, upon arrival at LBCCD Superintendent-President Dr. Reagan Romali and the College were able to completely reverse this trend, bringing salaries and benefits below **90%** for the first time in years!

The findings were based on data standards provided by the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO). The data was calculated by LBCC's Institutional Effectiveness (IE) team that took information from the CCCCCO's DataMart to access Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) and awards data for all California Community College districts. The IE team then calculated the ranking based on a ratio of FTES to awards.
